Day one

Arrival to Moscow

Moscow is one of the ten largest megacities in the world and the largest city in Europe and Russia. More than 12 million people live here. The city is named after the eponymous river flowing through it.



Day two

Moscow City tour and the Tretyakov Gallery

The 2nd day of the tour is dedicated to visiting Red Square, St. Basil's Cathedral, GUM. A pleasant end of the day and its highlight will be a visit to the Tretyakov Gallery, where you should definitely see the

most famous works of the Russian painting - Malevich's Black Square, Shishkin's Morning in a Pine Forest, Vasnetsov's Heroes, Ivan the Terrible and his Son Ivan 16 November 1581 by Repin and many others.



Day three

Tour to the Kremlin and the Armoury Chamber

Today you will visit the unique tourist, spiritual and political place in modern Moscow - the Moscow Kremlin, which is the largest medieval fortress in the world and the oldest building in Moscow.



Day four

Novodevichy Convent and Subway Ride. High-speed train to Saint Petersburg

Your 4th day in Moscow is devoted to visiting the Novodevichy Convent and Moscow metro ride. Today you will also move from Moscow to St. Petersburg on a modern and comfortable high-speed train Sapsan - a favorite way of locals to travel between these two cities.

Day five Saint Petersburg City Tour

This day is dedicated to a sightseeing tour of St. Petersburg - a city, which was the official capital of the Russian state for almost 2 centuries (from 1730 to 1918). You will visit St. Isaac's Cathedral, which is considered the largest cathedral in Russia, the Savior on Spilled Blood, Nevsky Prospect and many other sights.

Day six

Guided Tour to the Hermitage museum and Russian Folk Show

The state museum Hermitage in St. Petersburg is a unique palace complex in which rare and richest expositions of masterpieces of painting, sculptures and architecture and also historical values of the previous centuries are collected. Nowadays it is one of the biggest and most popular complexes – it enters in TOP-20 of the most visited world's art museums and contains about three million invaluable exhibits for the period from the Stone Age and till the 21st century!

The folklore show in the Nikolaevsky Palace “Feel yourself Russian” is a unique opportunity to feel the history and soul of Russia!

Trip to Peterhof

Peterhof was the summer residence of Peter the Great. The Peterhof fountain complex has 173 fountains and 4 cascades. Peterhof was built on the one hand in response to Versailles, and on the other hand, as a triumphal monument to the successful completion of Russia's struggle and access to the Baltic Sea.

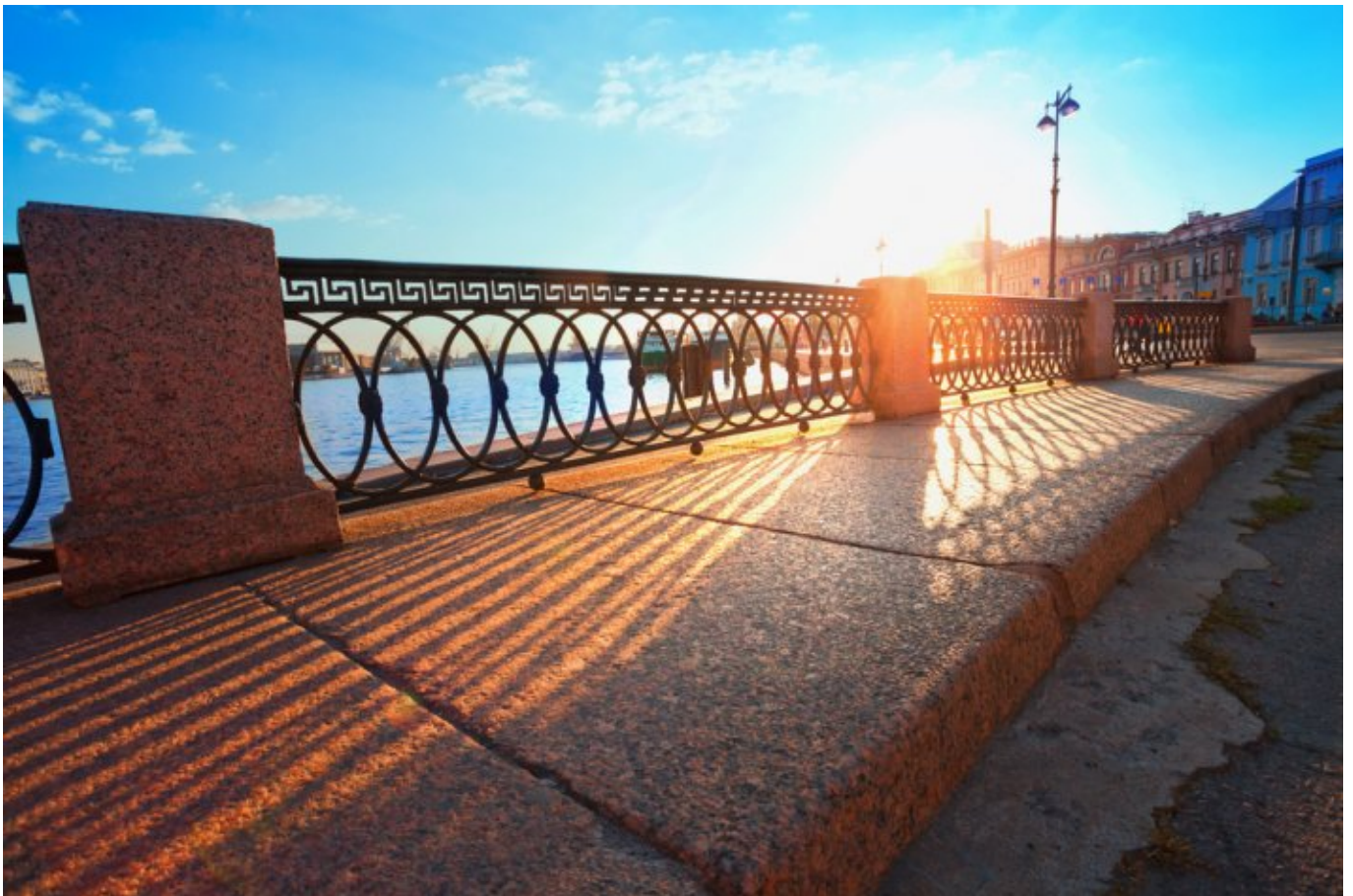
Day eight
